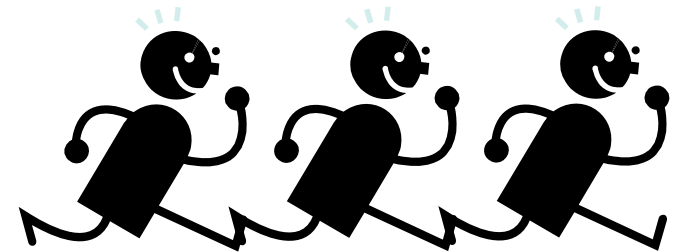

## Program Details

- Physical education at WSVH is specially designed for students who are blind or visually impaired.
- This course can provide .5 high school credits for students aged 15-21. 70 hours of activity, instruction and assessment are required to receive credit. Districts must approve the class for credit to be given. The class can also be taken for no credit.
- There are 5-12 spots available for this program.
- Activities will be presented with modifications. Students attending the program for credit must be capable of participation in the activities listed.
- Students will be served meals on campus and will be housed in the WSVH dorms. Transportation to and from the WSVH campus is the responsibility of the family.
- There is no cost for this program, although families are encouraged to send some spending money.
- Registration will be from 4 pm to 6 pm on Sunday, July 5. Departure will be 10 am on Friday, July 17.

## Classes Offered

The summer program curriculum will include instruction from a licensed Adaptive Physical Education Instructor in the following areas, including weekend activities:

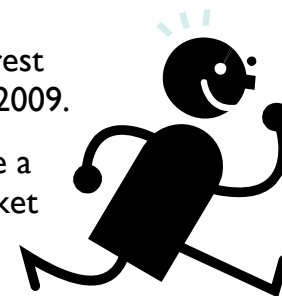
- **Fitness Tests:** based on the Presidential Fitness Program, with additional norms for students who are blind or visually impaired.
- **Weight Room/Conditioning:** using station work on a variety of fitness machines and light weights.
- **Aquatics:** based on the American Red Cross "Learn to Swim" and "Water Safety" courses.
- **Team Sports:** Rules and skills for the sport of Goalball and introduction to the USABA modifications for Track and Field.
- **Lifetime Leisure & Recreation:** experiences in bowling, biking, archery, ice skating, roller skating/rollerblading, canoeing, fishing and yoga.
